## **S** brac



BRAC is delivering lifesaving services from Ukhia down in Teknaf in Cox's Bazar. We are serving forcibly displaced Myanmar nationals as well as host communities in the following major areas.

### **HEALTH AND NUTRITION**

- 1,202,200+ patients received primary health care (PHC) services through 10 PHC centres & 50 satellite clinics
- 1,021 babies delivered
- 45,261 ante and post natal check ups have been conducted
- 273,000+ fever cases treated
- 122,900+ cases with acute watery diarrhoea treated
- 28,000+ people tested for tuberculosis (TB). 574
  patients that were diagnosed with TB are being
  treated
- 400+ people tested for HIV and 5 diagnosed as HIV positive
- 33,000+ people tested for malaria and 7 malaria cases confirmed
- 7000+ pregnant and lactating mothers received iron and folic acid tablets
- 4,000+ moderate acute malnutrition children received supplementary food
- 50,000+ children (< 5 years) received nutrition supplement.

### **PROTECTION**

- 215 child friendly spaces established
- 47,000+ children are receiving recreational support
- 50 community-based protection committees formed
- 9 information points, two women friendly spaces and three community centres are functioning.

#### WATER, SANITATION AND HYGIENE

- 11,500+ latrines providing access to sanitation for 500,000+ people
- 20 fecal sludge management units have been constructed.
- 16,000+ latrines de-sludged and 2300+ latrines decommissioned
- 1,310+ shallow tube wells & 206 deep tube wells installed for 440,000+ people's access to safe drinking water
- 4,600+ bathing cubicles built
- 71,000+ hygiene sessions conducted
- 3,300+ hand washing stations built
- 31,500+ sanitary napkins distributed
- 72,000+ water purification tablets distributed
  47,000+ alum (Fitkiri) distributed
- 48 dumping stations built
- 7,056 waste bins have been set up in the settlements.

### **EDUCATION**

- 300 learning centres established
- 24,108 students have access to learning centers
- 500 teachers have been assigned to guide the students
- 105 women received training on tailoring from women friendly spaces and community centres
- 98,300+ households visited by community volunteers to disseminate lifesaving messages on WASH, sanitation, nutrition and protection.







### AGRICULTURE AND ENVIRONMENT

- 9,800+ trees have been planted in makeshift settlements
- 22,000+ trees have been planted in host communities
- 103,000+ households have received vegetable seeds both in the settlements and host community to boost their food security
- 59,000+ sacks of briquettes have been distributed for fuel source
- 800+ solar lights have been distributed.

#### SITE MANAGEMENT

- 17 CIC coordination meeting held
- 55 community meetings conducted
- 11 sector coordination meetings conducted
- 5 zonal coordination meetings conducted.

### SHELTER AND NON-FOOD ITEMS



- 43,000+ tarpaulins distributed for building shelters
- 4,500+ shelter tool kits have been distributed
- 214,000+ blankets provided
- 256,000+ sets of clothes distributed, including warm clothes for children and elderly population
- 9,600+ families received kits with household items
- 400+ water containers have been distributed
- 6 community kitchens have been established to support 90 households.

### DISASTER RISK REDUCTION



- 9,424 vulnerable shelters identified in risky areas and 547 households have been relocated to safer places
- 58 stairs, 11 bridges, 25 drains, 44 retaining walls have been constructed
- · 84 bathing cubicles, two deep tube wells built
- 18 latrines, 847 latrines decommissioned.


